The ghosts of Moholy-Nagy, the Russian Constructivists, and Stan Brakhage haunt Raissnia's second solo show at the gallery. An installation using manipulated found film strips and reworked slides is projected onto a wall, and accompanied by a minimalist soundtrack (by Charles Curtis). Architecturally abstract paintings are less interesting than the multimedia piece, though they take the same raid-the-vaults approach to art history, harking back to early Abstract Expressionism, when palettes pared down to stark black-and-white were the rage.
